He is presently featured in David Moss' new group Dense Band. He has also collaborated with Elliott Sharp, Arto Lindsay, Ikue Mori, Susan Deihim, Fred Frith, Butch Morris, David Garland, and many others; playing his turntables along with their more traditional instruments.

He has composed for dancers/choreographers Yoshiko Chuma, Robert Kovich, Christine Brodbeck and Kinematic.

He is presently working on an opera, Dead Stories, to be premiered in May at <u>Just Above Midtown</u>, in New York City.
