Perhaps the most enigmatic figure in avant-garde cinema/video, Takahiko limura mediates Zen spirituality and technology with playful irony. The evening follows his experiments from the erotic to the conceptual with screenings of works from the 60s: Al (Love) (with Yoko Ono soundtrack), Filmmakers (portraits of Andy Warhol, Jack Smith, Jonas Mekas, Stan Brakhage, et al), Flowers (body paintings by Yayoi Kusama); and works from the 80s: John Cage performs James Joyce, and MA: Space/Time in the Garden of Ryoan-Ji (produced for the Metropolitan Museum of Art).
