

KUMIKO KIMOTO is a Korean who was born and raised in Osaka, Japan. She landed in New York City in 1981 and began to choreograph and present works with composer/drummer Yuval Gabay in 1986. This collaboration has grown to become Dance Kumiko Kimoto Co. which has been presenting its full productions in the U.S. and Europe ever since. The company has been funded by New York State Council on the Arts, National Endowment for the Arts Inter/Arts, National Performance Network Creation Fund, Meet the Composer, The Jerome Foundation, Dance on Tour, Harvest Works Inc., Westaff and the Pagnano Memorial Fund at the Field. Kumiko received a National Endowment for the Arts Choreographers Fellowship in '90 and '91 and a New York Foundation for the Arts Artists' Fellowship in '91. She would like to mention deep appreciation to Lisa Marielle Bleyer and Linda Sastradipradja for their inspiration, Yuval Gabay for his long-time support and Stan Pressner for his tremendous generosity.

LISA MARIELLE BLEYER is from Montreal. She has danced for companies in Boston, Venezuela, and New York. She has also presented her own work in a number of venues in New York, and will be participating in the Fringe Dance Festival in Toronto this summer.

ANTHONY CHASE has been making films and doing installations in the performance and b arena since 1983. He is a collaborator with the productions of John Kelly & Co., in made films for "Akin" '92, "Maybe its Cold Outside" '91, "Love of a Poet" '91, "Find My Way Home" '89 and for "Pass the Blutwurst Bitte" '86, in which he also performed and toured festivals in the U.SA., Canada and Europe. He is the recipient of a 1991 Bessie Award. His own short films include "Rude Girl Pic-nic," "Bloodless Pharaoh" and "Mali-Mali '90".

YUVAL GABAY is a drummer/composer. He has been collaborating with Kumiko Kimoto for the last six years, both in her choreographic work and in the band BOSHO. He also has composed music for choreographers such as David Zambrano, Paul Langland, Jo Andres and Sarah Shaggs. He is a member of David Linton's "ELECTRIC OWTHAUS".

KIRIKO KUBO is one of the most active comic artists living in Japan. She has directed the film "Cynical Hystery Hour" (four episodes with music by John Zorn) and one of the characters from this film was featured in the TV commercial and the train station posters for the Asahi Newspaper. She has also written esssays and story for "Rakugo-ko", etc., has produced and directed a two and a half hour TV program for Fugi Television Network, and has designed record jackets and book covers: the album COBRA, by John Zorn: the CD Tonarino-Akko-chan, by Akiko Yano and the Japanese version of "The Friday Book," by John Barth.
