MISS SHANGE AT THE KITCHEN

New works by Ntozake Shange and Jessica Hagedorn will be presented tonight and tomorrow at 8:30 at the Kitchen Center for Video and Music, 484 Broome Street, between West Broadway and Wooster Street in SoHo. The Shange work — "Mouths: A Daughter's Geography" — incorporates poetry, dance and music. It is described as a fanciful and feminist statement about how Miss Shange relates to black people in various countries. The work by Miss Hagedorn, who was born in the Philip-

ines, is a minimusical about a man who leaves the Philippines because of its contradictions and moves to the United States — finding new contradictions, which he cannot understand. Each author will participate in the performance of her work. Tickets are \$4. Reservations: 925-3615.
