TIMOTHY BUCKLEY, born in Indiana, graduated from Ohio State University and has lived in New York City since 1977. Mr. Buckley first presented his work in 1981 at Dance Theater Workshop and appeared as a soloist in the Men Dancing Festival at the Riverside Theater. Until 1982 he was a member of Nina Wiener and Dancers and contributed Shuffle Over Motion and Irish Jumping Songs to the company's repertory. In the summer of 1982 he travelled to Amsterdam and Düsseldorf to premiere an evening of two solo works, Crazy Dog and High Atmosphere. In 1983 Dance Theater Workshop commissioned and premiered Out of the Blue, which was also performed in Germany during a six-week residency at Die Werkstatt in Düsseldorf as well as in Duisberg and Aschen. BARN FEVER will be performed in December 1983 in Italy and Germany as part of The Kitchen's touring program. Mr. Buckley and his company will return to Germany in February to lead a series of seminars and workshops, followed by a two month tour throughout Germany. He was a 1983 recipient of a Choreographer's Fellowship from the National Endowment for the Arts.
