From December 3rd through the 31st, The Kitchen gallery features new work by Kevin Noble entitled "ENVY: an exhibition of pictures with videotape".

KEVIN NOBLE was born in 1952 in Brooklyn, New York. He received a B.A. in 1975 from the State University College at Buffalo, and an M.F.A. in photography from the State University of Buffalo.

Solo exhibitions of the artist's work include "Summerspace" at Hallwalls, Buffalo, New York, 1976; "Transparent Documents" at State University College in Buffalo, 1978; "Gossip/Film Out-Takes" at Hallwalls in 1978; "Think and Suggest" at Media Study in Buffalo in 1979; at The Kitchen, 1979; "Motion Pictures Winners Losers" at CEPA Gallery, Buffalo, 1980; and "Photographs by Kevin Noble" at Artists' Space in 1980. His work has been included in group exhibitions sponsored by Hallwalls; Anthology Film Archives; the Al-bright-Knox Gallery in Buffalo; Floating Museum/San Francisco Museum of Modern Art; N.A.M.E. Gallery, Chicago; Alamo Gallery, Buffalo; Center for Media Art, The American Center, Paris; The Third Floor in Atlanta; Upton Gallery, Buffalo; Alain Bilhaud Gallery, New York; and The Contemporary Arts Museum in Houston, among others.

Mr. Noble was a recipient of an Artists' Fellowship in 1979-80 from the National Endowment for the Arts. He lives and works in New York City.
