**Alva Rogers** is a 1995 recipient of Dance Theater Workshop's New York Dance and Performance Award (Bessie) for her work as co-creator of the stage adaptation of her radio play *Stained*. Called "New York's Down Diva," by *The Village Voice*, her performances and musical sound installations have been presented in festivals around the country including the Spoleto Festival USA. An accomplished actress, she has three films to her credit: Spike Lee's *School Daze*, Julie Dash's *Daughters of the Dust* and most recently, Shu Lea Cheang's *Fresh Kill*, an Eco Cybernoia film. She is currently a Lucille Lortel Fellow in Playwriting at Brown University.

**Fred Ho** is a Chinese American baritone saxophonist, a composer, writer, and an activist, all while leading The Afro-Asian Ensemble and the Monkey Orchestra. His epic action-adventure musical theater fantasy, *Journey Beyond the West: The New Adventures of MONKEY*, will be performed November 26, 28 & 29 as part of the BAM Next Wave Festival. He is a former construction worker, and retired hand-to-hand combat specialist trained in stealth assault techniques. He graduated from Harvard University.

**Elizabeth Alexander** was born in New York City and raised in Washington, DC. She has degrees from Yale University and Boston University and a PhD in English from the University of Pennsylvania. Her first book of poems, *The Venus Hottentot*, was published in 1990. Her poems, short stories and critical writings have appeared in the *Paris Review*, *American Poetry Review*, *Callaloo*, *The Village Voice* and *The Washington Post*. *Diva Studies*, a full length verse play, was produced by the Yale School of Drama in May 1996.

oppler Effect: With any wave-type motion, the frequency—the pitch of a sound or the color of a light—is determined by the rate at which the wave passes the observer. Sound approaches as a highpitched note and swiftly falls to a much lower pitch, passing through the true pitch at the point where source and observer are closest together. The conceptual center of *Doppler Incident* is anchored at this point of true pitch.

The performance begins in a darkened theater with a large curtain, on wheels, slowly approaching the audience from the farthest point back. As it closes in, a projected image comes into focus. It is a violent fight, A knife is involved. The video seems to document real events. At the point where it gets most intense, a voice, over the public address system, says, "I think you should re-cut it," What appears to be a verity, is seen to be only one version among many. *Excerpts from Mr. Marshall's proposal*
