GET AGRIPPA—A cyberpunk's dream. "Agrippa (A Book of the Dead)" is a collaborative work by novelist William Gibson and artist Dennis Ashbaugh. On Dec. 9, the book's text will be transmitted via modem from Wyoming to several computers around the world. Gibson's story, which is about the death of his father, is programmed to "self-destruct" once the words have been displayed. The actual books contain Ashbaugh's etchings, which are designed to mutate when exposed to light, and Gibson's story on a computer disk, complete with virus.
