Shlomo Gronich, composer, was born in Israel, where he achieved popular acclaim for his performances and records. He also composed music for theater, ballet, television and radio. He is presently living in New York. His latest project, a musical, taken from the Kafka novel, "America", will be presented at the Kennedy Center in Washington, D. C. this spring.

Toshi Tsuchitori was born in Japan, where he worked with the Evolution Ensemble Unity. He left Japan in 1975 to perform with the Hannya Shingyo Theater at the Public Theater in New York and the Festival d'Automne in Paris. His other theatrical experiences include a tour with Peter Brooke in the US and Europe.

He is now living in New York where he is working with Milford Graves and performs with a new jazz group "Split". "Split will appear this Sunday, Feb. 13 at the Environ.

Sheryl Sutton studied voice and dance in Chicago, her home, and acting at The University of Iowa. She later worked with Robert Wilson for five years, She has spent the last three years in Paris where she performed with János Gát and presented a solo at the Musée d'Art Moderne. While in Paris, she also made a film for television.
