TOM RUBNITZ A Video Retrospective

The Kitchen is pleased to present **Tom Rubnitz: A Video Retrospective** in the Video Viewing Room. The program premieres as an evening screening on Sunday, April 12, with M.C., The Lady Bunny, and live performances by Frieda and other surprise guests.

Tom Rubnitz is recognized as one of video art's premiere humorists. In 1981, he began videotaping shows at the Pyramid Cocktail Lounge producing work that shares a kitsch, comic sensibility and a disarming charm. It is there he met many of the performers who would both inspire and play featured roles in his work over the next decade, including Ann Magnuson, John Sex, John Kelly, Ethyl Eichelberger, Hapi Phace, DANCENOISE, The Lady Bunny, Sister Dimension, Freida, and others. His short works range from music videos, Public Service Announcements, psuedo-commercials and movie trailers to documentaries and video art works.

Tom Rubnitz has been living with AIDS for four years, and has witnessed the deaths of countless friends and collaborators, including John Sex, Ethyl Eichelberger and Tseng Kwong Chi. Yet his work has never wavered in its joyful celebration of life. Rubnitz's work is a unique document of a remarkable generation of young, mostly gay performers, many of whom have succumbed to AIDS. His work is a testament to the power of humor and to the remarkable community of artists who have inspired and are featured in Rubnitz's videotapes.
