Soledad Interrumpida is a collaborative performance piece by two Spanish artists, visual artist J.L. Alexanco and composer Luis de Pablo. In Soledad Interrumpida, a network of compressed air slowly animates a large group of plastic inflatables; the visual elements combine with de Pablo's electronic score to create a dialogue within a common order, defined by the geometry and character of the particular installation. There is no fixed seating; the spectators can walk through the slowly shifting forms. This performance is presented in conjunction with the New Images from Spain exhibit at the Guggenheim Museum (March 21-May 11).
