For the evening of Wednesday, March 30th only, Italian multi-media artist LUIGI ONTANI returns to The Kitchen in his first performance since last appearing here as "The Astronaut" in November, 1979.

Ontani, known for his tableaux-vivants and performances derived from select mythical, fictional and cultural heroes and folklore, uses his body as his primary medium. Through the use of costume, masks, environmental constructions and other disguises, he merges his own identity and contemporary perspective with that of the persona, rendering it timeless and eternal.

Ontani's personae, second to his Italian heritage, are fueled by his frequent travels to other cultures. Voyages to India between 1974 and 1978 added Shiva and Krishna, the Hindu gods of a thousand arms and a thousand faces, to his already extensive repertoire - including such diverse figures as Dante, William Tell, Don Quixote, Don Giovanni; Adam and Eve, David and Goliath, the Angel of the Annunciation; Narcissus, Onan, Bacchus, Hermaphrodite; Superman; Christopher Columbus; Pulcinella and Pinocchio. Recent trips to the island of Bali formed the inspiration for this Kitchen appearance.

While in Bali, Ontani became fascinated with the traditional masks carved by local artisans. In his use of these masks in performance, he seeks to recreate as well as reinterpret the mythology with which these masks are imbued.
