SPEW/New York

Thursday, April 1 - Sunday, April 4, 1993

This 4-day festival of QueerPunkZine culture celebrates underground music, literature and alternative lifestyles in five programs of film, video and performance. (SPEW, an annual festival celebrating *Homocore*, or gay 'zine culture, began in Chicago in 1991 and resurfaced in Los Angeles last year. SPEW 3 is scheduled to take place in Toronto in May, 1993.) SPEW/New York, as such, is an unofficial gathering, linking 'zine culture, alternative music video productions, unorthodox feminisms and gay sexuality in a non-academic context.

These videos go beyond the bounds of mainstream music video programming, creating their own standards and aesthetics.

An evening of video reviewing the relationship between sex workers and feminists. An historical/hysterical document of "catfights" within the women's movement over the last four decades.

Featured works include:

The world premiere of Catfight: Just When You Thought It Was Safe To Be A Feminist, directed by Chris "teen" Martin and Glennda Orgasm, with the help of Isabel Polar and Maria Beatty. This video features high-class call girl and post-feminist Tracy Quan, downtown filmmaker and bad boy Richard Kern, post-porn modernist Annie Sprinkle, hustling hunk Tony Love, and many others reflecting upon their experiences with the feminist community.
