The video exchange show is a collaborative project of (Harlem's) CAT VIDEO GALLERY-Center for Communication Arts and Technology, in conjunction with THE KITCHEN-Center for Video, Music, Dance, Performance and Film.in Soho.

In Narlem, a seven-part public screening series with open video dialogues among uptown and downtown media makers will take place in the Art Gallery of the Adam Clayton Powell-Harlem State Office Building, 163 West 125th Street at Seventh Avenue, Thursday and Friday evenings from 6:30FM to 9:30PM--April 5 & 6, 12 & 13, 19, and 26 & 27,1984

In Soho, a daily screening series of programs by uptown television producers and video artists will be held in the Video Viewing Room of THE KITCHEN, 59 Wooster Street at Broome Street; Tuesday thru Saturday from 1:00PM to 2:00PM--April 3-28,1984.

"BELIEF SANDWICH/RELIEF GAUNTLET", a three channel video art installation by Bill Stephens, which contrasts the dichotomy and positions of religious and party/social rituals in(African)American culture with those in the tradition of (African) primeval cultures, will be on continuous exhibition in the gallery of THE KITCHEN; Tuesday thru Saturday from 1:00PM to 6:00FM--April 7-28,1984

The "DOWNTOWN/UPTOWN TELEVISION FESTIVAL", will present a broad

spectrum of program innovations and styles created by uptown and downtwon independent producers and video artists. CAT VIDEO GALLERY and THE KITCHEN will exhibit the same programs simultaneously changing programs weekly in April;

first week: <u>Video Music</u>, from Soul/Reggae to TV Commerical to New Wave Rock second week: <u>Video Art</u>, from Computer Imagery to Video Interpreted Dance third week: <u>Avant Garde Video Performance Art</u>, from New York-Paris-Calif. fourth week: <u>Educational</u>, <u>Dramatic and Documentary Programs</u>, from soap opera to variety show to political struggle
