Through Feb 18.* Linda Hill's one-woman multimedia show is described as "campy couture comedy." She is a frantic delight as she races through characterizations amid great piles of clothes. And, to suit your socially conscious side, Hill asks that you bring your old duds to complement her pile, which will be given to charity at the end of her run.
