At 8:30 pm Thursday and Friday November 11 & 12, The Artists Jazz Band with Michael Snow will perform at The Kitchen. The group includes Gordon Rayner, Robert Markle, Nubuo Kubota, Jimmy Jones, Gerald McAdam, Terry Forester, Michael Snow, and Graham Coughtry.

The Artists Jazz Band (A.J.B.) from Toronto has been playing Spontaneous Composition music for fifteen years. "...exploration beyond accepted limits,"" ...chunks, visible blocks and floating clouds of sound...enourmously physical music...moments of great beauty."

Michael Snow belongs to the tradition of artists who work in more than one medium. Today Snow is one of the major figures in the avant-garde of film; his works which are shown in Canada, the United States, and Europe, continue to have a considerable influence on other artists. Born in Toronto in 1929, he began his career as a painter in the early 1950's and later turned to sculpture. Throughout his life Snow has been involved with music, during the early part of his career sometimes supporting himself as a jazz musician playing piano and trumpet. The seriousness of his musical intentions evolved into his work with the Artists Jazz Band, a group of eight artist/musicians who work with a form of improvisation known as Spontaneous Composition.
