

BIOS

Xavier Le Roy was born in Juvisy sur Orge, France, February 17, 1963. He studied biochemistry at the University of Montpellier. In 1987 he began studying dance with Véronique Larcher and in 1990 with Ruth Barnes and Anne Koren. Between 1991 and 1995 Le Roy worked as a dancer with the Compagnie de l'Alambic in Paris (choreographer Christian Bourrigault). Since 1992 Xavier Le Roy has lived in Berlin. He performed with the interdisciplinary group Detektor until 1997.

In 1993 he began to develop his own work and research and in 1994 he formed the group Le Kwatt in collaboration with the musician A. Birntraum and the lighting designer Sylvie Garot. They created *Things I Hate To Admit* (1994), *Zonder Fact* (1995) and *Burke*, presented as a triptych as *Narcisse Flip* (1997). In 1996 Le Roy began a collaboration with the photographer and video-artist Laurent Goldring, and with Le Kwatt they created *Blut et Boredom* (1996). In the same year Xavier Le Roy worked with the company Quatuor Albrecht Knust (Paris) on the recreation of the Yvonne Rainer piece *Continuous Project-Altered Daily* (1970) and *Satisfying Lover* (1968) by Steve Paxton. In 1997 he developed a research project in collaboration with A. Birntraum called *Das To.Be. Project*.

In 1998 Le Roy initiated a collective research project called "namenlos". In the same year he participated in the improvisation project CrashLanding@Lisboa (initiated by Meg Stuart, Christine De Smedt, David Hernandez and Dancas Na Cidade) and in the theory event Body Currency at the Wiener Festwochen (invited by Marten Spangberg, Hortensia Völkers and Christophe Wavelet). He created a solo performance called Self-Unfinished (8.Cottbuser Tanztage-Germany).

In 1999 Le Roy created a lecture-performance called *Product of Circumstances* (Podewil, Tanzwerkstatt, Berlin). He danced for Marten Spangberg in the project *Avant-garde* and for Alain Buffard (Paris) for the creation of *MORE et encore*. He formed the group in situ production and invited choreographers, dancers, video-artists and theoreticians to work on an experimental project called *E.X.T.E.N.S.I.O.N.S.*

In 2000, he conceived and realized a piece from Jérome Bel (*Xavier Le Roy*), collaborated on two events (*Meetings*) with Yvonne Rainer during the festival Tanz im August in Berlin, gave *E.X.T.E.N.S.I.O.N.S.* workshops in different countries and organized the event *E.X.T.E.N.S.I.O.N.S.* # 2.7. In 2001 Le Roy organized *E.X.T.E.N.S.I.O.N.S.* # 3.2 and # 3.3.

Giszelle, a solo created for Eszter Salamon, premiered within the frame of Le Vif du Sujet during the Festival d'Avignon in July 2001, produced by the SACD. In September 2003 he will premiere a new project called *Project*.

Between 1996-2001, Le Roy was artist in residence at the Podewil, TanzWerkstatt, Berlin, where he is now an associated artist.

Eszter Salamon studied dance at the National Acadamy of Dance in Budapest. In 1992 she moved to France where she worked with Mathilde Monnier at the Centre Chorégraphique National de Montpellier. In 2000 she began a collaboration with Francois Verret for the piece *Bartleby* and started to work on her own project in the frame work of the *Potlatch Dérives* during the Festivale Montpellier Danse.

In 2001 she moved to Berlin and worked on her first solo piece, What a body you have honey.

In 2002, in collaboration with Simone Verde and Herman Diephuis, Salamon created a piece in the frame work of *Hors Série* titled *PublicPresentation of a Work in Progress* (premiered October 3, 2002), and she is currently working on a project with women non-dancers from 15 to 70 years old for a piece which will premiere at the Clermont Ferrand's Opera on December 6, 2002.
