His New York debut was in the solo work Everybody Works!/All Beasts Count, premiered at the New York Dance Festival in 1976. In 1980 he premiered Sisyphus at the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts. He has been the recipient of three National Endowment for the Arts Fellowships, a CAPS Fellowship award for 1980 and received the 1980 German Critics' Award for Blauvelt Mountain, a work created with Arnie Zane.

Jones' most recent ensemble works have been Break!, an environmental piece created as a Xerox Affiliate Artist and presented by the Walker Art Center in Minneapolis, Social Intercourse, commissioned by the American Dance Festival in 1981 and revised for the Space at City Center in June 1982, Ah! Break It! for Werkcentrum Dans, Rotterdam, Holland in 1981 and an expanded version of Rotary Action, a work created in collaboration with Arnie Zane for the Mantis Company, to premiere as part of the 1982 London Dance Umbrella.

In February 1982 Jones will present a new work in collaboration with the celebrated percussionist/composer Max Roach and choreographer Arnie Zane as part of the Brooklyn Academy of Music's Next Wave series. A video/dance collaboration with video artist Tom Bowes is in progress with initial funding provided by the NEA.
