DAVID SALLE - INSTALLATION - BEARDING THE LION IN HIS DEN

NOVEMBER 15 - 26, TUESDAY THROUGH SATURDAY I - 6 PM.

Opening Tuesday, November 15 through Saturday, November 26, The Kitchen Center will exhibit an installation by <u>DAVID SALLE</u> entitled <u>BEARDING THE LION IN HIS DEN</u>. The installation uses all the traditional elements of installations: lights, sound, and pictures ordered into a minimal sequence.

<u>David Salle's</u> work has been exhibited on both coasts and abroad.

<u>Bearding the Lion in his Den</u> was most recently shown at de Appel in Amsterdam.

The installation consists of a "setting" in which are ordered ten high intensity light bulbs, two large black and white phonographs on opposite walls, a tape player and a small box of electrical components. An old Tim Buckley song, "Song For The Siren" plays, there is a pause, the lights flash on and off in random sequence for two minutes followed by another minute pause. The a-b-a sequence continues. The title of the piece is an old saying which means to taunt someone in their own home.
