‘Neutral Hero’ to Get Final Performances as Kitchen Regroups Post-Hurricane

Richard Maxwell’s play “Neutral Hero” will finally get its last weekend of performances in the first floor theater of [the Kitchen](#), which is being renovated after extensive flooding damage from Hurricane Sandy.

The play will run November 29 to December 1 at 8 pm, with a 4 pm matinee on December 1 as well.

In his review, Ben Brantley of the New York Times [called the play](#) “remarkable,” adding, “Even in descriptions of boredom and squalor there’s a glimmer of nobility, of the valiance required to get through one day.”

The Kitchen will attempt to re-book ticket holders from the original November 1 to 3 closing weekend. Remaining tickets will go on sale November 21. The theater’s phone service is still down, so ticket sales are online only at www.thekitchen.org.

In addition, The Kitchen’s annual benefit art auction has been rescheduled from November 12 to November 26 at 7 pm.
