

RALPH LEMON

(The efflorescence of) Walter

May 11 - June 23, 2007

Running parallel to his career as a well-known choreographer and dancer, **Ralph Lemon** has, for many years, also ventured into a number of other artistic fields such as writing, drawing, painting and video-making to research new forms that intersect visual art, language, and movement. *(The efflorescence of) Walter,* Lemon's first solo exhibition, maps out a territory related to his ten-year performance project, *The Geography Trilogy* (1995-2004), a meditation on race, place, and history presented as three distinct dance works at the Brooklyn Academy of Music.

This exhibition centers around "a chain of aberrant actions" Lemon developed in collaboration with **Walter Carter**, a 99-year old Mississippian and the main protagonist of the video works. Carter's recorded tasks, shown simultaneously on multiple screens around the central animation of James Baldwin, form an unpredictable and eerily poetic narrative that references sources as diverse as the artists Bruce Nauman and Joseph Beuys, the African-American folktale character Br'er Rabbit, and the artist's personal collection of 45rpm records. Along with drawings and paintings that extend Lemon's exploration of history and material culture, the installation also includes a spaceship made in collaboration with Carter and friends, constructed from recycled backyard materials. Together, the works come together to form an unexpected portrayal of the American South, one both retrospective and prospective, that raises questions about memory, memorialization, and transcendence.


