## RoseAnne Spradlin deals in dirty pretty things

fter 20 years in the field, RoseAnne Spradlin, 51, isn't an emerging artist, but her 2002 trio under/world was so harsh and unaffected that it seemed to sprout from a choreographer fresh on the scene. This fall, Spradlin reprises the racy piece, in which dancers wear next to nothing, and debuts a new duet, Rearrangement.

Time Out New York: How did you approach the theme of sexuality in under/world? RoseAnne Spradlin: I was exploring how you can yield to another person. I asked the dancers what they liked and were afraid of-sensually speaking. In a typical fetish situation, Athena [Malloy] wears a collar with a long rhinestone chain, like a slave. I had to find what was in the role that was a part of her-even though she might not want it to be. TONY: What is so appealing about nudity?

RS: It just looks good! [Laughs] It automatically raises the tension in the room. The audience has to deal with it, and then the nudity just starts to seem like it's the way things need to be.

TONY: Why are you drawn to the gritty side of dance?

RS: I'm interested in seeing the underneath part of things. My explorations are internal—I think my ideas come out most successfully when they're raw.—GK
