ROSEANNE SPRADLIN has shown her work in Dance In Progress (1995) and Working In The Kitchen (1990) at The Kitchen, and in Dance Theater Workshop's Fresh Tracks (1990 and 1994). Work has also been produced through DIA Center for the Arts, Dixon Place, La MaMa ETC, Danspace Project, and Movement Research at the Judson Memorial Church. Rose Anne has performed in choreography by Steve Gross, including the critically-acclaimed Frauen Gold (1989) and Crush and Glitter (1990) and a new duet commissioned by the American Dance Festival's YCC Program in 1995. Rose Anne has been an artist in residence at Ohio University and Indiana University, and has taught summers in Amherst, Massachusetts, and on the island of Tinos in Greece. Next month she will be a guest artist with Several Dancers Core in Atlanta. Spradlin's training includes an MFA in Art and BFA in Dance, both from Ohio University, ballet with Jaclyn Villamil and Cynthia Babat, and intensive studies with movement pioneer Bonnie Bainbridge Cohen, whose work focuses on perceiving the deep subtleties of movement. Spradlin is originally from Oklahoma City, Oklahoma.

ANGELA BRISNOVALI is a painter and a combined media artist who works in the theater as a set and costume designer. She received a BFA from Pratt Institute in painting/art history, and an MFA from Hunter College, in combined media. Her paintings are exhibited in the US and Europe, and her works are found in private and museum collections. In her latest projects, Angela works in installations that deal with he physical and psychological body and incorporate cast body-part objects, text and sound. She is currently involved in performance-oriented computer-generated videos with text, as well as the production of handmade books of still images and the written and spoken language.

JEANINE DURNING has worked and performed with several choreographers including Zvi Gotheiner, Wendy Perron, Dan Wagoner, Marcus Shulkind, and more recently Lance Gries, Jonathon Kinzel and RoseAnne Spradlin. Jeanine continues to explore her own choreographic interests in solo and duet forms. Jeanine is a member of David Dorfman Dance.

STEVE GROSS recently left his job at The Field to pursue his own work more fully. Currently, this includes a public access television show, *See TV*, which appears on channel 69 in Manhattan on Thursdays, April 25, May 9 &23, and June 6 & 20 at 11:30 pm. Steve has worked with RoseAnne for the last seven years. This association has been a rich source of artistic inspiration and satisfaction for him.

ALEX KAHN is currently resident lighting designer at The Kitchen, where he has designed the lighting for The Kitchen's Dance In Progress series and the Dance Improv Festival, as well as the premieres of music/performance works by Gordon Monahan, Mikel Rouse, Ken Butler, and Dudley Saunders. Outside The Kitchen, he has designed for The Roches at Town Hall, and for Compost West, a Japanese Noh Theatre ensemble, at the Ohio Theatre. His fabrications of puppets, masks, and other scenic elements have appeared in works by Meredith Monk, Tony Kushner, Ed Sanders, and in The Greenwich Village Halloween Parade.

PAIGE MARTIN is from Houston, Texas. In New York, she has worked with Marta Renzi and the Project Co., Amy Sue Rosen & Derek Bernstein, Hope Clark, Sarah East Johnson, Maxine Moerman, Margaret Hallisey, Gardner Post of E. B. N., Fritz Welch, and most recently Neil Greenberg. She has been working with RoseAnne since 1993. Her own work has been performed at Avant Garde-Arama, Dixon Place, the Knitting Factory, 600 Club, in Hot House at P.S. 122, University Settlement House, and new works to be shown at the Cooler on May 6 and P.S. 122 on June 7.

ELENA PENGA is a bilingual performer, director, playwright who lives and works both in Greece and the US. Prior to this Elena has been seen with Hit & Run Theater and in Anne Bogart's Vaudeville Workshop Presentation through Movement Research. In Athens, she has directed/created: Desdemona's Sweetheart, The Greek Alien, The Poisons of the Sea, and A King Listens, which toured to Lisbon, Portugal, as part of the 7th Biennale of Young Creators in Europe in 1994. US Credits: Don Surrealism (The Open Eye Theatre, NYC), The Greek Alien (The Open Eye Theatre, NYC), Kollwitz Presents a Brief History of Modern Art (Nada, NYC), Gorky's Wife (Bay Area Playwrights Festival, The Magic, SF). Elena holds a BA from Wesleyan University and a MA from USC. She has trained extensively in the Suzuki method of acting and the A. Bogart Viewpoints.

MIKI NAVAZIO is a critically acclaimed composer and guitarist who has performed and recorded with some of the finest modern jazz artists in the world, including Reggie Workman, Oliver Lake, Joseph Jarman, Leroy Jenkins, The Lounge Lizards, and many more. He is the recipient of commissions from the NEA, the New York State Council for the Arts, and Meet the Composer. He recently completed the score for *All Over Me*, his first for a feature film. Previous collaborations in dance include work with Donald Byrd, Sabrina Peck, Dawn Saito, and Catherine Tharin. Miki is thrilled to be working with Ms. Spradlin at The Kitchen.

A native of Philadelphia, PA, VERA ORLOCK discovered modern dance with Kathryn Karipides while earning her BS degree in Music Education and Harp at Case Western Reserve University, from which she later received her MFA in Dance. She has performed with Nancy Meehan, Mimi Garrard, and Albert Reid. Since 1993, she has been an Assistant Professor of Dance at Kansas State University and has also been amember of the dance faculties of IU, Bloomington and UNC, Charlotte. Her choreography has been recognized by grants from the Ohio Arts Council, the NY State Council on the Arts, and UNC, Charlotte. Vera is frequently a guest artist/teacher in Europe and the US. She is a Certified Practitioner and Teacher of Body-Mind Centering®, the provocative work in experimental anatomy and physiology and developmental movement developed by Bonnie Bainbridge Cohen.
