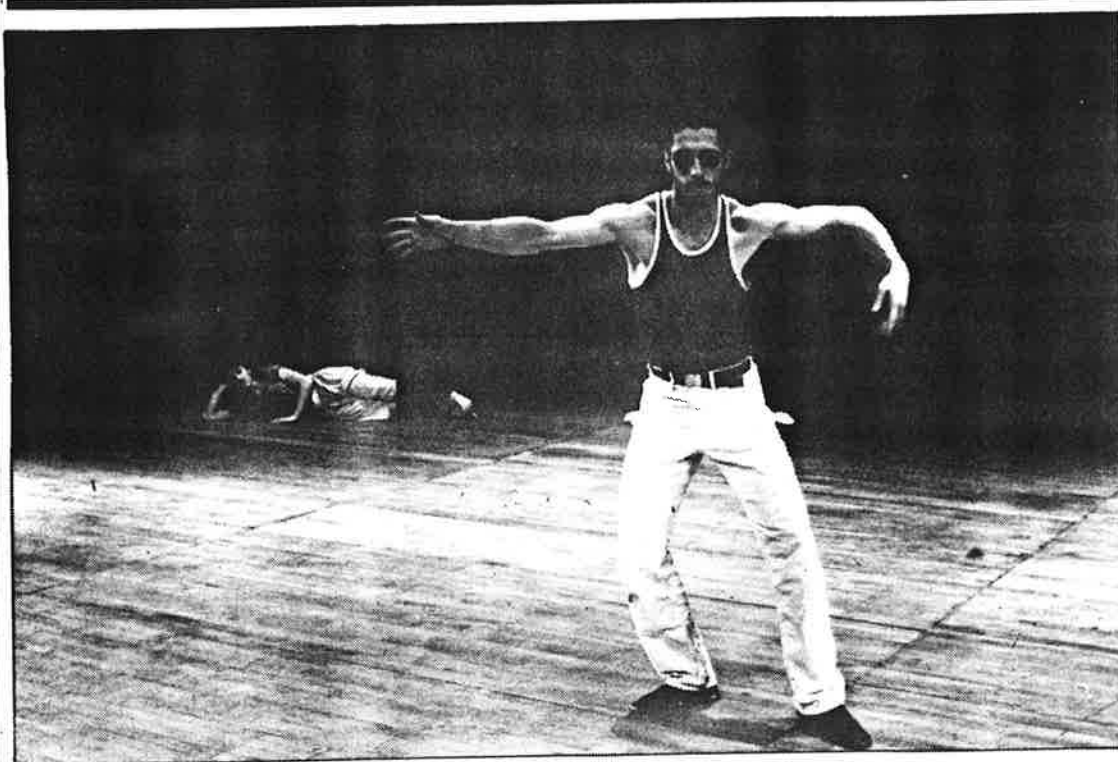

The title is descriptive, for Paxton will improvise his way through Gould's definitive readings of music which virtually defines integral structure. One wonders if Paxton will dance to all 30 (that's thirty, count 'em thirty) of Bach's 1736 variations for harpsichordist Johann Goldberg.
