For three evenings only, April 16-18, The Kitchen will feature actor David Warrilow in Moments in Classical Literature, an evening of dramatic readings, theatre, and music based on the classics. In addition to solo performances excerpting the Bible, Shakespeare, Voltaire and the "Essay on Hamlet" by Jules Lafforgue, Mr. Warrilow will present a duet with Patti LuPone taken from Noel Coward. Moments in Classical Literature will feature original music by Johann Carlo, Michael Butler, Henry Stramm and Val Kilmer.

DAVID WARRILOW, born in England, began his association with the works of Samuel Beckett in Paris in 1956, when he appeared in a production of Play. After moving to the United States in 1969 and helping to found the company Mabou Mines, he has performed in The Lost Ones (which earned him an Obie Award), Cascanda, Mercier and Camier, A Piece of Monologue (especially written for him by Samuel Beckett), and this year, Ohio Impromptu. Other appearances include Richard Foreman's Penguin Touquet and Strong Medicine, JoAnne Akalaitis' Southern Exposure, Rebecca Horn's La Ferdinande with Valentino Cortese in Italy, and, currently, as Jacques opposite Patti LuPone's Rosalind in Liviu Ciulel's As You Like It at the Guthrie Theatre in Minneapolis. This performance marks Mr. Warrilow's return to New York after As You Like It closes in early April.
