Filmmaker, performance artist, and writer Miranda July returns to The Kitchen to present her new muctimedia performance piece THINGS WE DON'T UNDERSTAND AND DEFINITELY ARE NOT GOING TO TALK ABOUT, it tale of hearthreak and obsession that is so familiar you could full it yourself. In fact, members of audience play lead and supporting reles in the performance. This work is also a look inside July's filmmaking process: her next feature film revolves around the same themes and characters.

July first received critical acclaim in New York for her performances at The Kitchen, Swan Tool (2001) and Love Diamond (2000). Most recently, she is best known as the writer and director of her feature length film Me and You and Everyone We Know (2005), which won a special jury prize at the Sundance Film Festival and four prizes at the Cannes Film Festival, including the Camera d'Or for best first feature film. Her stories have been published in The Paris Review, McSweezey's and The New Yorker, and a collection of stories. No One Belongs Here More Than You, will be published in May 2007.
