In early 1979, CHARLES LIBIN directed Rock Lobster, a 16mm film documentary of the B-52's first appearance in New York City at the newo-defunct rock club, Hurrah. Shortly after, with cameraman Paul Cameron, he formed Intake Productions. Later that year, Libin designed and curated an elaborate video system at Hurrah. He has since directed films and videotapes for record companies and bands. These works have been used within performances (a rear screen interlock projection for the 2-YOUS), as well as for promo purposes. He is also presently in pre-production stages of a film project for Philip Glass's new record on CBS Masterworks. His latest project, a dramatic film No-Incident, will be completed in late summer 1982.

MICHAEL SHAMBERG

Michael Shamberg is an independent video producer and American representative for Factory Records, an independent English record label which was among the first to experiment extensively with the production of video promos. Shamberg will present a selection of work produced by himself as well as several other independent producers which will demonstrate the chronological development of this work, including the bands Joy Division, Blurt, Certain Ratio, Section 95, New Order, and others.
